The appellation Corbières is the largest of the Languedoc region, spreading from the foothills of the Pyrenees to the south of the Massif Central. 10 different Terroir can be found delivering a mosaic of expressions. From this large territory the Hautes Corbières (High altitude Terroir) where the village of Lagrasse, home of Les Auzines, is located have always been renown in the history. No surprise then that a monastery settled in the area 8th century and shaped the viticulture of the region.

Domaine Les Auzines is a unique family run estate in the Corbières appellation, South of France. Isolated on a rocky plateau, at 1200 feet altitude, in the heart of some of the most beautiful, untouched countryside in France, the vineyards have been cultivated organically since the early 90's. This allows the grapes to express their true character and mature in ideal conditions where the vineyards grow in true harmony with nature. The resulting wines express freshness, elegance and finesse.

SOIL TYPE _____

Calcareous clay soil – 1,200 feet high
Yields 25 hl/Ha.

VARIETAL _____

Syrah 40% Grenache 40% and Carignan 20%

VINIFICATION _____

Hand harvesting. Destemming, long tank and temperature controlled fermentation. Aged in oak barrels for 14 months (2nd and 3rd use)

TASTING NOTES _____

Its deep red robe with purple highlights indicates a rich, concentrated body but this wine also has surprising freshness and elegance. Ripe cherry fruit with typical Languedoc notes of herbs (thyme, sage) and pepper. Can be served slightly chilled.
